



Enfield Book Fair FAQ

What is the Book Fair?

It's an EEHSP fundraiser where students can shop for books from Scholastic in a pop-up bookstore at school.

When is it?

Twice per year at Enfield and Erdenheim; once in the fall and once in the spring.

Where is it?

Currently, it's held on the Gym Stage at each school.

Why is the Book Fair important?

It encourages students to read! Together, the four fairs each year raise more money for the EEHSP than any other fundraiser. The EEHSP funds a wide variety of programs for all students at Enfield and Erdenheim, including assemblies, field trips, and recess equipment.

What is Preview Day?

Teachers bring their classes to browse in 15-minute slots on Preview Day (Monday). Volunteers help students by writing down titles and prices of books they wish to buy on their wish lists (a half-sheet of colored paper). Students bring the wish lists home to show their families.

How do students at Enfield buy books?

Circle the books on the wish list that you have chosen. Send in payment with the wish list Tuesday through Friday (earlier is better because some titles sell out; please add 6% sales tax). Enfield students do not buy in person; orders are collected by the teacher. Volunteers fill the orders and deliver them to the classroom, usually the same day.

How can I buy books in person?

Adults with badges may shop Tuesday through Friday, 11 am-1 pm. If you want to pull your child from lunch or recess, please ask at the front office. Everyone can shop on Family Night, Wednesday 4-7 pm (no badges required).

Is there any other way to buy from the Book Fair?

You can order from our online store using this [Scholastic link](#). Orders still benefit the EEHSP and arrive about two weeks after the fair. Shipping to the school is free.

What payments are accepted?

Cash, check (made out to EEHSP), credit card (adults only), or the new [Scholastic eWallet](#), a convenient digital payment option.
